	Vegetation Management	Trimming or cutting down trees to keep them away from powerlines
	Undergrounding	Undergrounding powerlines in the highest wildfire-risk areas
	Enhanced Safety Settings	Protecting powerlines with safety settings that shut off power quickly if a hazard is detected
	Public Safety Power Shutoffs	Turning off power for safety as a last resort during severe weather
